

ACCESS: Aging Concerns, Challenges, and Everyday Solution Strategies

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Overview

ACCESS is a large-scale, mixed-method study that will yield a taxonomy of **everyday support needs** for individuals **aging with long-term disabilities**.

Research Questions:

- What is the frequency, nature, and distribution of problems in everyday activities?
- What are the response strategies for these challenges (e.g., technologies, tools, assistance from others, own methods)?

Target Population

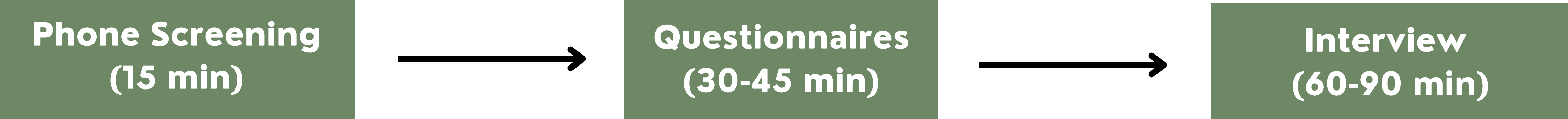
Targeting 60 individuals per group who are:

- Aged 60-80
- Fluent in English
- Live in the United States
- Have had condition or impairment for at least 10 years

- Phase 1 (N=180)**
Low vision/blind
Mobility
Deaf/hard of hearing

- Phase 2 (N=180)**
Macular degeneration and glaucoma
Multiple sclerosis
Late-deafened
[In progress]



Study Design



- Questionnaires**
- TechSage Minimum Battery
 - Group Questionnaire (Vision, MS, Late-Deafened)

- Interview** (via Zoom or phone)
- Rating Activity: Participants rate how difficult it is for them to various activities across 6 broad categories
 - In-Depth Questions: Follow-up questions about the activity identified as "most difficult" in each category to assess challenges and response strategies
 - Wrap-Up Questions: Assess additional challenges (e.g., self-advocacy; safety & transportation); their most difficulty activity overall; an activity they feel they have dealt with successfully; and advice for others aging with disability

Activities Covered

Healthcare

- Participating in healthcare appointments
- Accessing health information
- Managing medications
- Managing health, diet, & nutrition

Social and Interpersonal

- Socializing in-person
- Socializing remotely
- Group activities
- Interacting with new people

Basic Daily Living

- Bathing, showering, or grooming
- Dressing
- Using the toilet
- Moving around the home

Household Management

- Housekeeping & home maintenance
- Cooking, preparing, and/or ordering meals
- Obtaining goods & services
- Managing finances

Work Service & Learning

- Working
- Volunteering and civic activities
- Caregiving for others
- Continuing education

Leisure & Recreation

- Engaging in entertainment events/activities
- Exercising and physical activity
- Engaging in non-active leisure
- Traveling for leisure
